

## **SRW November 23 Legislation Nation**

**FYI** – There are 11,427 bills and resolutions currently before the United States Congress, but of those only 7% will probably become law. *Source: Gov Track US*

**HR-2 Secure the Border Act of 2023, (Diaz-Balart-R-FL & McClintok-R-CA)** passed the House 5/11/23, 219-213, awaiting Senate action. Senate version is **S2824, (Cruz-R-TX)**. House version includes:

- a. Plugging holes in the Asylum System
- b. Blocking administration's catch-and-release policy
- c. Requires E-Verify
- d. Detains Family Units from exploitation by cartels
- e. Reins in illegal abuse of parole
- f. Puts teeth in efforts to deter visa overstays

As before R Senators are working with D Senators, including CO Senator Bennett as a committee (Gang of 6) to create their own version of border security giveaway. *Source: Brietbart & Numbers USA*

**HR-6211 SAFE Act, (Safeguarding Americans from Extremism Act), (Zinke-R-MT)** would render Palestinian Authority passport holders, (covered aliens) inadmissible to the U.S.; revoke visas issued to covered aliens on or after Oct. 1<sup>st</sup>; bar DHS Secretary from granting future asylum or refugee status to covered aliens. 10 co-sponsors. *Source: Cong. ### **HH 2.0 Special Session**

Democrats increased the residential property deduction from 15K to 55K and reduced the assessment rate from 6.765% to 6.7%, on residential properties for only one year. No Republican solutions were considered. The Legislature formed a 19-member task force to find long-term property tax solutions. Most will still have increased property tax bills. No reductions on commercial property. *Source: Colorado Freedom Force*
